
### Student Profile: Fall 2015

- 70% part-time
- 62% women
- 29% minority
- 39% ages 25 and older
- 26% pursuing a career/technical certificate or degree
- 53% of all enrollments are online
- 573 degrees and certificates awarded FY2016
  - 71 Bachelor's degrees
  - 304 Associate's degrees
  - 198 Certificates of Achievement
- 75% AA and AS graduates enroll at a 4-year institution within one year – 55% continue their education at GBC




#### 10-year enrollment trends:

### **10-year enrollment trends:** Fall semester percentage FTE by mode of instruction




### College-level course success rates by mode of instruction

### Question 1 - Tuition over the last 5 years: Has it exceeded the Annual Consumer Price Index?

Tuition has increased 20.4% over the last five years while the CPI has increased 9.8% over the same time period.








# Question 6 – Student performance on nationally-normed tests

Source: Noel-Levitz, 2014. Mean differences are statistically significant at the .001 level of probability in every category.



# Question 8 - Graduation rates of first-time, full-time degree-seekers by fall cohort: on-time and completers within 150% of on-time



On-time graduates receive a certificate in one year, an Associate's degree in two years or a Bachelor's degree in four years. 150% of normal time is two years for a certificate, three years for an Associate's degree or six years for a Bachelor's degree.

#### Challenges to students graduating on time

- Students start out full-time, but end up part-time 70% of all students enrolled at GBC are part-time.
- Life happens 39% are 25 or older. They have families and jobs.
   Sophomore students responding to a survey in spring 2011 reported that 23% worked more than 40 hours per week, 36% worked 21-40 hours per week, 26% worked from 1 20 hours per week, and only 13% did not work at all.
- Students enter unprepared for college 57% of all graduates from 2012-13 through 2015-16 took developmental classes in order to graduate.
- Online enrollment is now 53% of all FTE. Even though course success rates in online classes at GBC are higher (i.e., 74%) than the national median of 66% for lower division classes they are 16 percentage points lower than overall course success rates in the classroom.

# Question 9 - When was the most recent campus climate survey on academic freedom and intellectual diversity?

2015 annual survey on executive administration work performance – survey of all employees on knowledge of and satisfaction with work performance of GBC's President, Vice Presidents, and Deans.

2015 Increased membership on President's Council to increase faculty input and diversity of opinion.

#### **Additional Information**

#### Presidential performance metrics:

- 1. Fall-to-fall retention at GBC all full-time students = 72% and all part-time students = 40% in 2015
- 2. Diversity at GBC the two largest minority groups are Hispanic at 18% and American Indian/Alaskan Native at 3% making up 16% and 4%, respectively, of the 2016 college graduates
- 3. Grants received at GBC the 2015 raw number was 25 yielding \$5,980,000
- 4. Contracts at GBC the 2015 raw number was 5 yielding \$364,400
- 5. Unrestricted donations at GBC 280 separate donations = \$488,000
- Corporate donations and scholarships at GBC 13 separate donations = \$1,145,000

- GBC is an incredible asset to the state of Nevada and its rural citizens
- GBC continues to improve its effectiveness and efficiency, doing more with less
- On virtually all of the most important indicators, GBC is moving the dial in the right direction (e.g., question 2 – direct to indirect employee ratio, question 5 – hours taught by full-time instructors, question 6 – performance on nationally normed tests, question 7 – student satisfaction and question 8 – graduation numbers)
