Area - A defined geographic region for Indian Health Service administrative purposes. Each Area Office administers several Service Units.

Community Health Representative (CHR) - Indians selected, employed, and supervised by their Tribes and trained by IHS to provide specific health care services at the community level.

Contract Health Services - Services not available directly from IHS or Tribes that are purchased under contract from community hospitals and practitioners.

Health Center - A facility, physically separated from a hospital, with a full range of ambulatory services including at least primary care physicians, nursing, pharmacy, laboratory, and x-ray, which are available at least 40 hours a week for outpatient care.

Health Station - A facility, physically separated from a hospital and health center, where primary care physician services are available on a regularly scheduled basis but for less than 50 hours a week.

Service Area - The geographic areas in which IHS has responsibilities--"on or near" reservations, i.e., contract health service delivery areas.

Service Population - American Indians and Alaska Natives identified to be eligible for IHS services.

Service Unit - The local administrative unit of IHS.

User Population - American Indians and Alaska Natives eligible for IHS services who have used those services at least once during the last 3-year period.
