department that we shelve this course until the BA in English program has a more robust selection of students. Three was simply too few to have engaged,

cross-media conversations about these areas.

Additionally, I attempted to cover too many forms of media in ways that would then reflect their own compositions. This was inefficient and pulled too hard on areas where there were either technological limitations or I did not have the necessary expertise to move forward with ideal assignments. Music, in particular, needed a guest lecturer and perhaps a more innovative media approach than it had.

All in all, I think this will be a good course for the future, especially with a tighter focus on the rhetorical principles in these other media. The students were motivated and gave a good effort throughout. I do not, however, regard this course as successful at this time. (10/06/2017)
