Criterion Met: Yes	Students displayed a strong knowledge of significant themes, issues and events covered relative to the U.S. West's history. However, I am convinced based on other results that students would benefit from more coverage of significant themes, issues and events that occurred on the national level. This would provide more context for the western developments that I have emphasized in this course (as there is no U.S. History prerequisite for this course). This would be relevant, as the course examines the U.S. as national experience and depends on knowledge of various themes and events in

Criterion for achievement: 70 percent or greater of students having no points deducted from their paper for needing to have address more extensively the national context in relation to the western topic explored in their paper.	61.3 received no deduction of points for needing to have addressed more extensively the national context in relation to the western topic explored in their paper. Criterion Met: No	Students struggled to connect historical issues and events that occurred in the West with their national context. This indicates a lack of preexisting knowledge of U.S. history on the part of a significant number of students. It should be noted that lower- division work in U.S. history is not a prerequisite for this course. 2. Action Plan: Include more coverage of significant events, issues, and themes in U.S. national history in the course.

Action Plan: Retain current practices.

Results: 86.7 percent of students who submitted the required book review scored 75 percent or greater. Criterion Met: Yes	 Results Analysis: Students impressed me with their ability to critically evaluate and analyze scholarly works of history. Most students were able to identify a book's main argument and discuss its strengths and weaknesses as a scholarly work of history. Action Plan: Retain current practices.

Students struggled with writing their papers and identifying acceptable academic peer- reviewed sources in their research. 2. Action Plan: Although I expect students to have developed adequate writing and research skills prior to enrolling in upper-division courses, I will devote additional time to these topics going forward.
