Assessment Measures

Survey - Point of contact survey to secondary teachers that participated in one of three GBC CTE College Credit Articulation Workshops. SurveyMonkey after completion of workshop.

Criterion: 90% participants are satisfied or very satisfied with the quality of offerings. 100% of available personnel participate. **Notes:** Lost grant funding for this in FY16 after three years. Intend to continue to offer these opportunities, but will have to review.

Results

Reporting Period: 2015-2016

Criterion Met: No

11 secondary participants completed the survey. 6 were from Ag Mechanics, 3 were from Early Childhood Education, and 2 were from Health Science/Nursing. The survey asked the participants to rate their satisfaction with several items about the information presented. Below is screenshots from the SurveyMonkey results. The average score of each individual criterion is 79.59% of participants were satisfied or very satisfied with information offered. Several participants left comments and feedback overall in the survey. 100% of available personnel did participate. (07/21/2016)

Actions

Action: Carefully reviewed comments and feedback for articulation workshops. Considered ways to improve workshops based on feedback. Several CTE College Credit classroom visits were scheduled for direct contact with students in the pathways that hosted articulation workshops. In the 2016-2017 school year, the CTE College Credit Coordinator will review previous feedback and consider implementing ideas presented the survey.

Most of the unfavorable feedback was a result of a GBC degree program considering eliminating CTE College Credit articulation agreements for high school programs. These conversations will reopen fall 2016.

Due to the loss of funding, articulation workshops were held

via IAV instead of in person. 86% of the participants were satisfied with the articulation workshops being held via IAV. (07/21/2016)

Follow-Up: Articulation workshops will continue to be held IAV and from 3P.M.- 5P.M. to accommodate school schedules and reduce substitute and travel expenses. Unless otherwise indicated by secondary and post-secondary personnel.

CTE College Credit Coordinator will continue to work with district administration and teachers and GBC administration and faculty to develop professional development activities deemed necessary by all partners. CTE College Credit office will continue to survey participants in professional development events via online formats. (07/21/2016)
