PRESIDENT'S COUNCIL
February 21, 2012

1. Approval of Minutes – The minutes of the President's Council meeting on January 31, 2012, were approved.
2. Equipment Requests – Norm Whittaker presented the Budget and Finance committee recommendations for funding of the equipment requests. President's Council discussed the recommendations. There was a question about funding ongoing licenses in the Diesel department as it looks like it should be an operating expense. The committee does not look at what has been distributed to the departments from the lab accounts. They do go back to the prior year to see what was awarded. The committee looks at the strategic planning and if the equipment request is listed there. There was \$400,000 to award. Bret Murphy stated that the CTE area requested equipment money for a diesel engine (\$15,000) when in fact that is not a priority for the department. If the requests could be signed off by a dean or VP first before it goes to the committee we could avoid unnecessary requests. It is important to tie resources to institutional priorities. It is an accreditation issue. We need to establish a process so that it goes through some kind of check off list. President's Council approved the equipment requests with the exception of the \$15,000 for the diesel engine and the \$3,600 for the license continuation of Caterpillar ET as that will be donated by a vendor. The Budget and Finance committee needs to reconvene so that the \$18,600 can be reallocated according to priorities. The committee will present their recommendation for this remainder at the PC meeting next week.
3. Dream in Do It and other Workforce Development Happenings – Bret Murphy gave an update on the workforce training programs. The electrical program has two sections that had sixteen students per section. We are now down to twenty-three students out of the thirty-two. If we can get funding they would like to add a third section to the electrical program. But for now they will be moving the morning section to the evening so we will have an afternoon section and evening section next year. Out of the sixty-four MTC scholarships awarded we are now down to fifty-four. We will have a larger waiting list. We will allow eighteen per section in the beginning. Bret reported there are three candidates for the two diesel instructor positions. This is on the same budget we have had for operating budgets for years. The diesel program has twenty-nine students out of the original thirty-two. They will raise it to eighteen students per section next year. Welding has two sections with sixteen per section. We are down to twenty-one students now in welding. Instrumentation has one section that is down to fourteen students from sixteen originally. Mill Wright has one section with the full sixteen still enrolled. Looking at another section for Industrial Mill Wright. There is a total capacity for the CTE programs

of one hundred twenty students for all the programs. Almost half of them are attending on scholarships. There were one hundred eighty-five applicants for the MTC scholarship last year. The application process was more rigorous. The contract training has four instructors, but one has recently resigned. There are three people applying. The Mobile Maintenance training has ninety classes. There are approximately twelve students per class with the mines guaranteeing ten per class. The classes are scheduled January through December and are two-day classes to accommodate Cortez and Barrick. We need to continue the contract training but it is difficult to keep qualified instructors who are lured to the mines who offer better benefits and pay. The mobile maintenance classes went to non-credit this year. The fixed maintenance training has one instructor who has twelve classes that are three-day classes. We are considering going to Round Mountain to do training in the process area.

Bret reported on the Dream It Do It initiative in Elko. It is a national, not for profit organization whose main focus is getting people into manufacturing. They want to start going into the grade schools to promote training for manufacturing fields. In Elko we will promote manufacturing and mining. Elko has already prepared and submitted an inventory of what we are already doing in K-12 and higher education. Bret reported that a survey was sent out to business and industry here and we got twenty-five back out of two hundred sent out. The Dream it Do It program has ties to the Lumina Foundation and the Gates Foundation. Elko is now the lead for the state.

4. Institutional Planning & Effectiveness Discussion – Cathy Fulkerson

- National Community College Benchmarking Project – Cathy Fulkerson reported the results of this survey. We participated for the first time in this survey. She went over the funding sources on page one. Reviewed the withdraw rates on page five. There probably needs to be a statewide policy change in regards to withdraws. Reviewed the contract training numbers on page six. For next year contract training will be non-credit and that will impact our numbers.

5. Conversion from GroupWise to Gmail – John Rice reported on the email conversion discussion. John said the question that persists in the proxy issue in Gmail. We determined that we do not need to purchase the additional archiving space in Gmail. The email name would be either name.name@gbcnv.edu or name_name@gbcnv.edu. We would be concerned about transmitting student information. Currently if we send anything outside of the GroupWise, once it leaves GroupWise it is no longer secure. That would be the same with Gmail. Perhaps we can look into some kind of encryption. The cost is not that big for the consultant to do the transfer from GroupWise to Gmail. The only thing holding us back is security questions. Duane will be looking into all of the functions. This topic will be brought back for a decision at the next PC meeting.

8. Classified Council Update – Carmen Matlock reported the Classified Council Valentine Day bake sell did very well. All proceeds go to the Tony Salvatierra scholarship. Classified did discuss the CLASS award. They like the idea of all those nominated each month to have lunch with the president. They thought it was good to keep it in the groups. They did wonder what the other institutions were doing.
 9. Accreditation Update – Mike McFarlane reported the report is due on March 1. The last accreditation steering committee meeting is scheduled for February 27.

 11. President's Report – Lynn Mahlberg forwarded the formula funding update email to President's Council. The economy of scale is critical for GBC and WNC. Administrative costs are the same if you are teaching a class of 20 or 200. David Freistroffer will serve on the Quality, Rigor and Assessment committee. The legislative committee to study higher education funding has an RFP out to select a consultant to study funding.
