1. Faculty Senate – No report.
2. Data Dashboard Presentation – William Brown reported on the development of new dashboards. They provide more relevant and timely data and are constantly being refined. Bill went over the fall dashboard.

4. Classified Council Update – Joe Micke reported the annual Classified Duck Race raised \$920. The Classified elections are done. Kimberly Hess and Cami Gerbi have been elected the co-chairs.

8. Foundation Update – Matt McCarty reported the Foundation Development Committee is proposing an Open House College Day. Matt is working with staff to schedule rooms and technology. Commencements and pinning's were successful. Ely will also be having their first commencement next year at their convention center. That relieves pressure in Elko because we are at capacity.

GBC can expect another budget cut of approximately \$200,000 potentially because they decreased the weighted student credit hour for CTE course from 156 to 153. So, we will have to put the search for the Fine Arts position on hold. The remodel of the welding lab did not get funded.

Improvements in the Student Services area will have a positive impact in fall. The Pennington Foundation wants to hear more about the welding remodel so there is potential there.

There was a successful search for the Dean of Online Education. The person is coming in from Utah and is familiar with the area.
