## **New Business: INFORMATION ONLY:**

- 1. Recap from NSHE Classified Council Meeting:
  - Cheyenne Stocks attended the NSHE Classified Council Meeting earlier this week. One topic of discussion were the retention bonuses that started rolling out today.
  - Also discussed was Governor Lombaro's road trip to colleges around Nevada. We haven't heard about him coming to GBC, but he has made stops at UNR and WNC already.

- Also, TMCC is looking into flex hours as a cost saving measure.
- If anyone has any questions, comments, or concerns that they would like to be brought up at a future meeting they can contact Cheyenne.

## **POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS:**

- 1. Dean Donnelli Discussion on alternate schedules for summer:
  - Ex. of alternate schedules include working four ten-hour days a week and getting one day off and working nine-hour days and half-days on Fridays.
  - TMCC is looking into alternate schedules as a cost saving measure, altering their operating hours. GBC isn't looking to implement this as a cost saving measure, and still wants to be open 8am-5pm M-F to ensure students still have access to the main points on campus.
  - In order to ensure that our campuses are available 8am-5pm M-F, departments would have to determine their needs and work together to make sure that there is always someone there; ex. one person works ten hours Monday-Thursday and gets off Friday while another person is off on Monday and then works ten hours Tuesday-Friday.
  - Holiday weeks will still stay as 8am-5pm, though, as to not cause confusion with HR policies and procedures in that regard.
  - Every department is different, so what works for one department may not work well for another; especially for those that only have one person. In same cases, like in Admissions, it might be beneficial to be open a little later than normal and be available for more students, so having alternate hours would allow for each department to provide coverage based on its own needs.
  - Departments that only have one person can participate as long as they
  - One of the main focuses in this endeavor is to ensure that there are not feelings of inequity. This kind of scheduling can be very attractive to people, and may help with retention as well as drawing people in.
  - It might be too late for this to be implemented for the summer, but since we are not looking to implement it as a cost-saving measure and do as much as TMCC, it could be. Dean Donnelli will come back to a future meeting with updates as things get moving.
- 2. Discussion and updates on the Duck Race, May 4th, 2023:
  - We are two weeks out, and things are getting pretty crazy around campus.
  - It was agreed that we should table the Duck Race until a later date because we want to put on a quality event and not scramble to put something together just to have an event. There hasn't been marketing materials sent out yet, so it's an easier process.
  - One suggested possibility was to do it in the Fall as a back-to-school event "quack-to-school", we
    would just need to double check with Buildings and Grounds about when they're going to be
    shutting the water off.
  - A motion to table the Duck Race for a later date yet to be determined was made by Gaye and seconded by Cheyenne
- 3. Discussion on the election of new officers:
  - Cheyenne or Louellen will send out an email with a call for nominations. This will include a small description of what each position does as well. Next month we will vote.
  - Nominations will be accepted until May 15<sup>th</sup> so that we can hopefully get something together by the May 19<sup>th</sup> meeting to present. Voting will then be open until June 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 4. Discussion on a Classified Staff Newsletter:
  - This newsletter would be for all Classified Staff and would be beneficial to those who are not
    involved with Classified Council but would still like to know what is happening and what we are
    doing as a group.
  - This could be as simple as a regular email or done up more like the Weekly Post. It could lead to
    more involvement and will connect the Classified Staff members from all campuses even when
    we can't.
  - One idea was to include new/employee shout outs, and we would include the date/times of our meetings as well as the agenda and minutes from the previous meeting.
