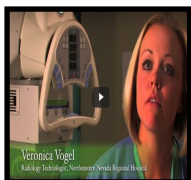
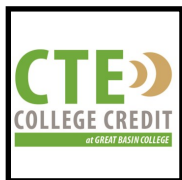

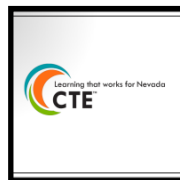

## Human Services and Radiology



At Great Basin College we offer a two-year Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in nursing. The program is fully approved by the Nevada State Board of Nursing and accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc.

Great Basin College (GBC) offers a two-year, five-semester program leading to an Associate of Applied Science in Radiology Technology. This is NOT a totally online program. The first year, the courses are at the Elko Campus on Tuesday afternoon and all day Wednesday. The second year students participate in a clinical setting. The clinical rotations can be throughout Nevada.

## About CTE College Credit



CTE College Credit promotes students transition from high school to college. High school CTE Completers are eligible to earn free college credit by taking articulated Career and Technical Education courses at their high school.

Starting the **2015-2016** school year, students will need to complete a three year high school CTE sequence, earn a 3.0 GPA within the CTE sequence, and pass both the technical assessment and employability skills assessment to be eligible to receive CTE College Credit.

Students must apply to receive their CTE College Credit and apply to become a Great Basin College student. ## CTE Events! Enroll in your pathway!



According to the Association for Career & Technical Education, the average high school graduation rate for students concentrating in CTE programs is 93%, compared to an average national freshman graduation rate of 80%. Can you believe registration for next year is already taking place? Its never too late to start taking CTE classes in your high school. To earn FREE CTE College Credit, students need to take three years of a pathway. This is a great way to visit with your high school teacher or counselor to determine the next class in the pathway.
