Dear Sir:

I am writing to you in great hepes Hoping that you will second to this wish of mine. I will like for you to intercede in this metter for me. I have a mother end sister living in Bishop, Calif. At the same address which I want to help by given them part of my wealth. They are in great need and I feel that I should help them being that my mother and sister was not mention in my father's will. My wealth consisted of land which is very poor in value of money concern But I also had \$120.00 hiden in the potatoe shed at the time of my arrested. I told my cousin Nettie Moore house and Amy Roberts . living in Coleville, Calif. p.o. Address about the money hiden in the spud shed The way I mentioned before in my letter, I would like to leave or have turned over to my mother the \$120,00. Wy mother is real old and she certainly needs the money very badly. To be exact this money was paid me in accordance to my parole by my father, I was paroled to him September 23, 1933. He gave me a monthly payment of \$1.00 per day, for 7 months. And when they divided my father's estate of which I receive 1/2 and two of my nephews 1/4 such they added my money to the estate. This money has absolutely nothing at all to do with the estate, and about all the satisfaction I can get out of them is I should be satisfied by receiving 1/2 and they say it does not seem to them that I am not losing any money. They say that I am getting far more than that out of the estate, please notify me why the order was made in this matter to give my half sister Susie Parson deceased. And two of my nephews got their mothers share and leave my mother out who deserves everything. The agents there claim my mother and father were separated two years before I landed here, by tribal law, which is not true. Anything you can do or tell me in regards to any of this. Father was in the hospital 9 days before his death and I was very near constant attendance at his side before I called up this Indian Doctor at Yerington, Nevada, I wanted to save him. Father died intestate.

Dear Mr. Show:

Mr. Much formered to us the letter you wrote him recently about your father's estate and the division of the money. Mr. Mash of course did not know maything about this because you do not belong to the Secremento Agency. The easy thing he could do with it was to refer it to us.

I believe that we have written you our opinion in the matter, so that this should be perfectly eleer to you, but in cese it is not, here is how the metter stands, so far as we are concerned. Your father's estate was probated by Judge Anderson and his decision in the matter was approved in Bashington. decision gave you helf of the estate and the other helf want to the two some of your deed sister. The testimony abound that your father and mother had been separated and were considered and so it was decided that divorced before your father died. she was not entitled to a share in the estate. The \$120 which was found in the potate shed was decided to be part of your father's estate and not your personal money. However, since you requested that \$120 be turned over to your mother, we have paid her from the funds that you had on deposit here the sum of \$120 in monthly installments. You have left to your eredit in this office at the present time \$147. If you would like to have as pay some of this to your mother, we shall be glad to do so. We do think that it is a commendable thing on your part to try to see that your mother does receive proper care, and we are glad to help in carrying out that wish so far as we can. That we cannot do, is to change the decision regarding the estate.

As for your feeling that you have not been treated fairly in the matter, we can only say that we still believe that someidering the fact that you are in prison for causing your father's death,
