Dear Sir:-

After making examination and inquiry relative to application of Louis B. Murphy, Indian, for allotment on the public domain, which was forwarded to you in yesterday's mail I find that Louis has already been allotted 160 acres the description of which is :

SW/4 of the SE/4 and the SE/4 of the SW/4, Sec. 26, and the NE/4 of the NW/4, Sec. 35. Tp. 1 N., R. 26 E., N. D. M.

This land was patented to him September 25, 1907, but he informs me that he has lost the original trust patent which he received. He now wishes to relinquish the above described land in order that he may file on that covered by the application which I forwarded to yesterday.

Please advise what action on Louis' part will be necessary and if you have a relinquishment blank to be used for this purpose kindly furnish me with same in order that I may prepare it <sup>and</sup> have Louis sign it. I presume that his relinquishment must first be prepared before he can legally apply for the new tract, in which case will you simply hold the application pending the receipt of a relinquishment.

## PETITION FOR THE SALE OF LAND BY ORIGINAL ALLOTTEES.

Alfotee Louis B. Murphy No. 95 Agency Walker River Bishop Sub-Agency.

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs:

I hereby make application for the sale of all of my allotment, described as the NE-1/4 of the NW-1/4 of Sec. 35 and the SE-1/4 of the SW-1/4 and the SW-1/4 of the SE-1/4 of Sec. 26, in Tp. 1, N.R. 26, E.M.D. California.  
 My reasons for making application for the sale of the above-described land are: containing 120 A.

I want to sell my land because it is too high in altitude, and I would like to buy some other land elsewhere, where I can raise better crops. Also I want to use some of the money to buy some supplies for myself, and equipment to use.

Answers to the following questions are submitted:

1. Age? 42 Degree of Indian blood? Full Married or single? Widower  
 2. Give names and ages of your husband or wife and children, and if they have been allotted, give number of acres held in trust by each. Children. Virginia Murphy Parker age. 21.  
Foster Murphy-age 18. Mamie Murphy-age 13.

3. How many acres does your own allotment contain? 120 acres.  
 4. Have you any interest in inherited Indian lands? If so, give name of deceased allottee, number of acres, appraised value, and the share you are entitled to No interest in inherited lands.

5. In this application does any part of your allotment, are your home and improvements located on the land that will be held in trust? Application covers all the allotment.

6. If your house and improvements are located on the land covered by this application, what is the value of such improvements? \$100.

7. Have you sold any part of your allotment, or any interest in inherited land? If so, how much did you receive and what use was made of the money? Have sold no part of the allotment.

8. Have you any individual Indian money to your credit? If so, how much? No individual Indian Money.

9. Do you cultivate any part of your land? If so, how many acres are in cultivation? Two or three acres in cultivation, and nine or ten in pasture.

10. Are you self-supporting? If so, how is the self-support obtained? Yes. By working for ranchers and on road.

11. What is your physical condition? Good. Eyes not normal.

12. Has any person requested you to offer your land for sale? If so, who? The Sierras Construction Company.

In case the land described above is sold, I hereby agree that the proceeds derived from the sale may be disposed of in accordance with the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT.

1. Are the statements made by the applicant correct? Yes

2. What is the character of the land covered by the application? The land is located at an altitude of 7000 feet, is practically all rough sagebrush land and only a very small part is capable of any use.

Irrigated, 2 acres; irrigable, None acres; timber, None acres

Agricultural, None acres; grazing, 112 acres

3. What is the value of the land, and if it is offered for sale, will it, in your opinion, attract bidders? As a farm the land is not worth more than \$500 but on account of its being riparian to a mountain stream, the water right is worth much more. It will not attract bidders.

4. Have you any reason to believe that a prospective purchaser has used influence with the allottee to have the land offered for sale? If so, what are the circumstances? It is understood that prospective purchaser has asked the allottee if he wishes to sell the land. No other action was taken except this verbal question.

5. Give reasons why, in your opinion, it is for the best interest of the allottee to sell this land. Report fully whether the allottee is in any way incapacitated and whether he needs the money for any particular purpose. The land is so located and its character is such that it is unproductive and of very little value to the owner. He cannot make a living on the land, and with the price offered he can purchase better land elsewhere which will be more suitable to his needs. The allottee is afflicted with disease of the eyes so that his eyesight is considerably impaired.

6. Has any land of like character been sold in the neighborhood of the land covered by this application? If so, when and what was the price per acre? Land of similar character has been sold in the vicinity, and the prices for the irrigated land compare with prices paid for similar lands in the same locality.

7. Are there any local conditions, such as surveys or construction of proposed railroads, nearness to proposed town sites, access-roads, etc., which affect land values generally on your reservation, or particularly as to the tract of land covered by this application? The altitude and the fact that irrigation is necessary for any land of value governs and affects the values of all lands in this locality.
