of the Shoshone Indian linguisti¢ stock, were originally. divided into seven nomadic, and forestdwelling tribes which lived on vast territory in Colorado and parts of Utah and northern New Mexico prior to he arrival of the European settlers; they were the Capote, the Mouache, the Parlanucs, the Tabeguache, the Uintah, the Weeminuche, and the Yampa, Ute, which means "land of the sun" also gave the state of Utab its name.

There are currently around 3500 Ute Indians living on reservations in Utah, they own 1,300 000 acres of land on which they operate their own government, exploit their own resources, and continue to promote their heritage.
