Dear Sir:

Your letter of January S has been received:

The Forest officers who made the examination and survey of the land covered by the above designated application were personally essisted by the applicant and the corners were set and the land surveyed exactly as he desired it. furthermore, Jin Ike stated that he was perfectly satisfied with the area, and that it was all the land that he desired.

While you are correct in the statement that there is very little of the land that can be put under sultivation, owing to lack of water with which to irrigate the land, and that it has no Forest value; the balance has very little value as range because it is located in the low foothills, is very rooky and barren, and would not pay the applicant or enjone else to femce it for range purposes only, and if the applicant was given the full 160 acres the entire area in excess of the area oultivated would not support more than

two head of stock during a season. Furthermore, each settler is allowed to graze a small number of stock on the National Forests without permit, and it is very doubtful that Jim Ike will accumulate stock in emcess of that number.

While the Forest Service has no objection to giving the applicant the full eres; it would be of absolutely no benefit to him because he would rever utilize it. The present survey of the place includes all the agricultural land, and there is not sufficient water to irrigate more than one-half of that.

Personally I believe Jim The was well satisfied with the treat as surveyed until the activities of one L. F. Clar of Menhattan, Nevada, caused him to become dissatisfied.

I would be very glad to know whether or not the above emplanation as to why Jim Ike was given such a small area is satisfactory to you.
