Have you always thought that you have a novel in you? Here's your chance to show the world what you can do.

National Novel Writing Month is a fun, seat-of-your-pants approach to novel writing. Participants begin writing November 1. The goal is to write a 175-page (50,000-word) novel by midnight, November 30. Great Basin College Library is sponsoring this event in Elko. During the month of November, anyone in Elko who feels that they would like to write a novel is welcome to come to the college library and work on it. We will have computers available for their use, and special programs are planned to help writers get started, encouragement to keep going, and ideas about what to do when the novel is finished.

National Novel Writing Month started in the San Francisco Bay Area in 1999, and has grown into an international event. All over the world, during the month of November, novelists are busy working on their next books. Published works coming out of this event include:

The Library's Government Document Collection

DO YOU KNOW THAT GBC LIBRARY IS A FEDERAL DEPOSITORY?

Great Basin College Library was designated a Federal Depository for government documents in 1992. What is a Federal Depository? Congress created the Federal Depository Library Program over 140 years ago to insure that the public had access to government information. In a joint resolution from Congress, the House and Senate directed that House and Senate Journals and other information be printed and distributed for the general public's use. Today, there are more than 1300 depository libraries designated by Congress or a member of Congress to house the information for the public's use. Depository libraries collect, organize, preserve, and provide assistance to support the public's right to have access to this information.
