Secretary Vera motioned to approve Senator Huckleby's request with an amended cap of \$15.00 for supplies and an amended cap of \$85.00 for snacks and refreshments for Nature Club to go on a field trip to Ash Meadows on October 6, 2018. Secretary Johnson seconded. DISSUSSION: Nature Club President Kip Magee explained that they will be taking 15-17 people on this field trip. The supply money will be for plates, cups, napkins, etc. The snacks and refreshments money will be used to purchase sandwich supplies for lunches for those attending. President Linville was informed that there are around 15 new members in Nature Club. Nature Club Advisor, Rita Pujari stated that she will not fundraise and does not have the time. President Linville stated that all other SGA sanctioned clubs fundraise and only utilize SGA money to supplement their needs. It is not fair to ask that of other clubs and not expect Nature Club to follow the same rules. Nature Club Advisor, Rita Pujari stated that if SGA does not fund the trips, she will have to disband Nature Club. Student Advocate Mendez stated that there are fundraisers that are not time consuming, such as having a 50-50 drawing. The Officers and members of Nature Club can assist with the fundraising, as long as the Advisor oversees it. ROLL CALL VOTE: Bonnie Griffith- Yes. Brooke Johnson- Yes. Maribel Vera- Yes.
