On question \#1 $72 \%$ of student voted yes and $22 \%$ voted no, question \#2 $91 \%$ of students voted yes and got several pages of sports the students would like to see come to GBC. On question \#4 $61 \%$ of students voted yes but on question \#5 51\% voted no, and $48 \%$ voted yes willing to pay a fee between 2-4 dollars to support these sports.
