12. TUITION GUARANTEE & PREDICTABLE PRICING

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

President Linville led a discussion regarding Tuition Guarantee and Predictable Pricing. She went over what the differences between the two options were and will take a vote on which option SGA is in support of. Secretary Johnson motioned to approve Option B Predictable Pricing Program. Senator Vera seconded. DISSUSSION: Option A, the Tuition Guarantee doesn't benefit all students, just full time undergraduate students. Option B Predictable Pricing would affect all students and students would know what the cost of their tuition would be for each year for four consecutive years. Over 70% of GBC students are part time. President Linville will let the Chair of NSA, Chris Roys know how the vote went today for his letter to the Board of Regents. Motion Passed unanimously.
