10. FY 2020 SGA BUDGET APPROVAL

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

Senator Vera motioned to approve FY 2020 SGA Budget prepared by Vice President of Business Affairs, Sonja Sibert. Senator Marler seconded. DISCUSSION: Adjusted the revenue a little, between the FY2019 budget and FY2019 actual student fees, increased the graduation expenses based upon Winnemucca and Pahrump both having more formal graduation ceremonies this year, also increased travel as the new officers could be located in multiple locations, and if the Student Life Coordinator does travel to the centers strictly for SGA activities, then it could possibly be charged to the SGA account. Salaries and Fringe were adjusted to reflect the 4% fee increase that goes into effect 7/1/2019. Motion passed unanimously.
