FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

11. LEADERSHIP ACTIVITY

INFORMATION

Senator Cole led the group in a discussion about stress:

- What is stress? Stress can manifest as fear, worry, inability to relax, increased heart rate, difficulty in breathing, disturbance in sleeping patterns, change in eating patterns, difficulty in concentrating, worsening of pre-existing health conditions (physical and mental) and increased use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.
- Types of stress: Acute & Chronic
- Physiological effects:
 - 1) stress release hormone
 - 2) High blood pressure
- Psychological effects:
 - 1) Good way to reach goals
 - 2) Anxiety & irritability
- Coping with stress: sleep, eating healthy, exercise, connect with others, and relaxation
- Group discussion about how we each deal with stress: reading, finding control in simple tasks, deep breathing, chewing gum, fresh air, exercise (hockey, weightlifting, running), herbal drops, alone time, and nature sounds.
