10. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Chairs of each Committee (Graduation, Mascot, and Amendments) will discuss their progress of their committees.

GRADUATION- NOTHING CURRENT TO REPORT.

MASCOT- SENATOR JACOBSON MENTIONED THEY HAVE SEVERAL OPTIONS FOR NAMES THAT WILL BE PRESENTED SOON.

AMENDMENTS- SENATOR SOSA MENTIONED THAT HE IS WORKING ON GETTING THINGS TOGETHER. HE IS WORKING ON AN AGENDA AND HE IS HOPING TO MEET BY THURSDAY. PRESIDENT RAINE MENTIONED THAT WE MISSED THE DEADLINE FOR THE BOARD OF REGENTS MEETING, SO WE WILL HAVE TO WAIT FOR THE NEXT ONE. SECRETARY KIRKMAN STATED THAT SHE IS GOING TO RESIGN FROM THE AMENDMENTS COMMITTEE SINCE SHE IS GRADUATING.

SENATOR SOSA ASKED IF THEY MISSED THE DEADLINE, SHOULD THE COMMITTEE STILL BE MEETING? PRESIDENT RAINE ADVISED THAT WE STILL NEED TO WORK ON THEM FOR THE FUTURE. SENATOR JACOBSON ASKED TO BE ADDED TO THE COMMITTEE.

AGENDA AMENDMENT TO ADD VP OF FINANCE JOHN EVANS TO DISCUSS QUESTIONS ABOUT THE BUDGET. VP OF FINANCE ASKED WHAT QUESTIONS WE HAVE. SENATOR SOSA ASKED FOR HIS FEEDBACK ON THE BUDGET. JOHN ASKED IF WE ALL UNDERSTOOD HOW THE BUDGETS WORK. HE EXPLAINED OUR BUDGET COMES FROM STUDENT FEES. MOST OTHER SCHOOLS SPLIT THEIR BUDGETS BETWEEN SGA AND STUDENT LIFE. WE DO NOT. WE ARE LOOKING INTO SPLITTING IT OUT FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR INTO TWO SEPARATE BUDGETS. IF IT DOES NOT WORK OUT, WE WILL OFFICIALLY GO TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS TO SEPARATE THEM. HE WENT OVER HIS BUDGET AMOUNTS. THE BUDGETS WERE SPLIT PER CAMPUS AT \$9,000 EACH, PLUS THE ROLLOVERS. WE ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO CARRY OVER 25% ISH A YEAR. WE CAN CARRY MORE IF THERE IS A PLAN IN PLACE TO SPEND THE MONEY WITHIN THE NEXT YEAR. HE WENT OVER THE EXACT AMOUNTS OF WHAT HE IS SHOWING. ELKO HAS \$24,000, ELY HAS \$9,200, PAHRUMP HAS \$9,300 LEFT, AND WINNEMUCCA HAS \$6,600 LEFT. THERE IS OVER \$50,000 LEFT OVER. WE NEED TO SPEND IT, OR IT CAN BE TAKEN AWAY. JULIAN PROVIDED A BUDGET PROPOSAL, BUT SINCE THIS WAS NOT ADDED TO THE AGENDA AS AN ITEM IN TIME, WE CANNOT HAVE A FORMAL DISCUSSION ON THIS, AND IT WILL NEED TO BE ADDED TO A LATER AGENDA.

11. Unfinished Business

A. ELY WELCOME BACK SUPPLIES WITH SENATOR NASH

Senator Nash would like to request funds for welcome back supplies- backpacks, squishes, other school supplies, and candy. She is requesting \$1,000 for supplies.

SENATOR JACOBSON MOTIONS TO APPROVE THE MOTION. SENATOR COWAN SECONDS. MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

B. MEMORIAL DAY BBQ APPROVAL FOR REINBURSEMENT WITH JOE MICKE

SGA has sponsored the Battle Born Veterans Club Memorial Day BBQ for several years. They are requesting to temporarily use the SGA host account to facilitate purchases, and they will fully reimburse the account. They are requesting the temporary use of \$900 for food and prizes.

SENATOR JACOBSON MOTIONS TO APPROVE FUNDING. VICE PRESIDENT STOKES SECONDS. SENATOR COWAN ASKED IF THEY HAD THE OPTION OF FILLING OUT A STUDENT ORGANIZATION PACKET. HE IS NOT AWARE OF THAT, AND THERE ARE NOT MANY STUDENT VETERANS ON THE CAMPUSES. MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY

POSSIBLE ACTION

A. PAHRUMP SNO PINNING CEREMONY WITH SENATOR COWAN

Senator Cowan is requesting funding to support the SNO pinning ceremony at the Pahrump campus. The funds will be used for cupcakes, water, decorations, and venue expenses. He is requesting \$600.

B. GBC RODEO CLUB APPROVAL FOR CLUB FORMATION WITH KEVIN SEIPP

Kevin Seipp is requesting to provide information only about getting the Rodeo Club approved so they can form the club.

C. ELKO SNO PINNING CEREMONY WITH LACEY STEELE

Lacey Steele would like to request funding for the SNO pinning ceremony. This event is also being co-held with the Radiology department. She is requesting \$700 for supplies and \$600 for food and prizes.

SECRETARY KIRKMAN MOTIONED TO COMBINED THE LAST TWO ITEMS. SENATOR JACOBSON SECONDS. MOTION TO COMBINE PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

G. PAHRUMP FOOD BAGS WITH SENATOR COWAN

Senator Cowan would like to request funding to purchase additional food bags for students. They have exhausted current supplies, and the demand remains high. He is requesting \$250 for food and prize

funding.

H. PAHRUMP GRADUATION PIZZAS WITH SENATOR COWAN

Senator Cowan would like to request funding to purchase pizza and soda for the students attending graduation rehearsal in Pahrump. He is requesting \$600 for food and prizes.
